

COVID-19 Update Letter #2
(Revised as of 4-1-2020)

Dear Supplier:

As a follow up to our Update Letter issued on March 17, 2020, OG&E is notifying you of additional requirements for suppliers and individuals engaged in providing services to the company. During these unusual times, OG&E remains focused on the health and well-being of employees, suppliers, and customers and is taking precautionary steps to help minimize the spread of COVID-19 virus. To help with these efforts, you are expected to exercise prudent safety practices and to take all necessary precautions to help reduce any potential exposure to the virus.

Oklahoma's governor declared a state of emergency on March 15, 2020, and recently released an Executive Order further detailing certain restrictions and limitations for any individual entering Oklahoma to perform work. Please read [Executive Order 2020-07*](#) (see URL below) and give special attention to paragraphs 26 and 27.

Paragraph 26 specifies certain restrictions for persons entering the State of Oklahoma by air travel from an area of substantial community spread of Covid-19, to include the New York Tri-State area (Connecticut, New Jersey, and New York) and the states of Washington, California, and Louisiana. The Executive Order is currently in effect and applies retroactively to all persons who have entered Oklahoma after being in an area with substantial community spread within the previous 14 days. Those persons are required to quarantine for a period of 14 days after entering Oklahoma. Also, please familiarize your employees with the requirements of paragraph 27.

As stated in the previous letter, the following restrictions and protocols remain in place when accessing all OG&E facilities:

- Completion of an entry screening process focusing on current health status and potential exposures to COVID-19, and
- Body temperature measurements prior to entry using passive technology (non-contact).

The previous letter also communicated that suppliers connected to ISNet must upload their pandemic protocol plan to ISNet. Suppliers that have not already done so should complete this task as soon as possible. Failure to do so may cause your employees to be denied entry into OG&E facilities.
